A short history of MJCA

M J Carter Associates was formed in 1983 to provide consultancy advice to the waste and minerals industries. Our staff of three provided predominantly hydrogeological and hydrogeochemical advice, reflecting landfill practice in the early eighties.

By 1985 our nine staff had outgrown the accommodation in various kitchens and dining rooms and we moved into part of Station House, Atherstone, our first commercial premises. The Grade II listed Victorian building has significant architectural features and the lasting quality and high standard of workmanship associated with the building reflected the principles of the Company.

By 2003 we occupied all of Station House and additional premises in Atherstone. This accommodated our staff and the ever increasing technology that is now an integral part of environmental risk assessment, report and drawing production and data management.

Our physical expansion reflected the growing awareness of environmental issues by business and the public. Our staff encompass a wide range of disciplines and our client base has expanded well beyond the mineral and waste industries. What has not changed is that we continue to work hard to remain at the forefront of technological and legislative development.

We endeavour to provide a consistently high level of service and professionalism not only for our clients but also for our input into the development of guidance, legislation, research and professional bodies.

In 2003 we left the premises in which we grew up to take our place in the refurbished former colliery offices at Baxterley. The move to a redeveloped former colliery was in keeping with the familiar concepts of remediation and reuse, reflects the longevity of the company and provides us with a peaceful working environment with room for expansion.

We have successfully completed 30 years in the environmental consultancy business. In 1983 few people offered this service, but now several hundred companies list environmental consultancy as a major part of their business. Despite many tempting offers, we remain committed to our independence, which guarantees continuation of our principles and standards. In technical terms, our 30th anniversary is marked by significant changes in environmental legislation and the knowledge that future direction from Europe will bring further challenges and opportunities for us and our clients.

We are proud of our achievements over the last 30 years. We have taken an active part in startling changes in the technical and legislative issues associated with the protection and management of the environment and we look forward with enthusiasm to the developments and challenges of the future.
